WIFE - Mariam Cyempka "Molly" Barnes

Information from the files of the late Dr. June Rayfield Welch of Dallas, Texas, dated 29 Feb 1992, in the files of Cecilie Gaziano, 4511 Fremont Ave. S., Minneapolis, MN 55419; cgaziano@prodigy.net and cgaziano1@gmail.com. He said that her nickname was Molly.

"Beth Almy wrote, on 28 March 1985:

"When we went on a family fact finding trip to Wyoming in 1983, we learned that Mariam Cyempka Barnes Renner always wore a long black dress and a black sunbonnet. (She was always seen in those items of apparel, even in the house.) When I asked if anybody had pictures of her, I was told that she never wanted her picture taken. My Aunt Clara and Aunt Hazel (one in her 80's and the other in her 90's) say that Mariam was not a very social person. She preferred to spend time in the kitchen or out feeding the chickens, to socializing when their family visited. My aunts remember her sitting on the porch, smoking her corn cob pipe. Someone on that trip told us that she was a Mennonite, and attended either the Baptist or Mennonite Church." To this Dr. Welch added: "One of Mariam Cyempka's black sunbonnets is in the Thermopolis, WY, Museum with large pictures of Henry, son Addie, and Addie's wife, Katherine."

"Thomas Adison "Addie" Renner was born 31 October 1866, in Decatur, Texas to Henry and Mariam Cyempka (Barnes) Renner.

"The family moved from Texas to Bentonville, Arkansas in 1868, living there until 1882. In April of that year, the family set out with a covered wagon train with other families from Independence, Missouri for Oregon."

"After much hardship and many weeks of travel, they reached Pendleton, Oregon the latter part of October 1882. The family spent the first winter at Helix, a suburb of Pendleton. In the spring of 1883, they homesteaded near Box Springs; later the name changed to Condon."

"The Renners ran sheep in Oregon and Idaho. They were the first to take sheep into the Camas Prairie of Idaho, which was all open range at the time. Today, it is a rich farming district."

"In 1896, Addie came to northwest Wyoming in search of open land where he could run livestock. He returned to Oregon and moved to Wyoming in 1897."

"In 1897, Addie's younger brother, George Renner, set out for Wyoming's Big Horn Basin with several thousand head of sheep. The Renner family was the first to bring sheep into the Wyoming's Big Horn Basin from Oregon. Several family members homesteaded in the area of Gooseberry Creek near Meeteetse, Wyoming."

"In Wyoming, Addie ran sheep and got into the banking business. For a time he was invested in Renner & Jones, Bankers in Worland, Wyoming."

"Addie's father, Henry Renner, died of blood poisoning in 1903, at the ranch on Gooseberry Creek. He was a veteran of the Civil War, having served in the Confederate Army in Shoemaker's Company D, 1st Frontier District is Wise County, Texas. He was one of the first people buried in the new Meeteetse, Wyoming Cemetery."

"Thomas Adison Renner married Catherine Frances "Kitty" (McMahon) Wood on 14 September 1905 in Dawson County, Nebraska, at the home of her parents. Addie and Catherine took a honeymoon trip to Portland, Oregon, attending the World's Fair."

"Catherine was born 19 March 1879 in Wisconsin, to Irish immigrants, Patrick and Catherine McMahon. She worked as a clerk in W.T. Benbrooks' store in Meeteetse, Wyoming, and was a school teacher."

"Addie and Kitty resided on the family ranch on Gooseberry Creek. The ranch buildings and Meeteetse were then located in Big Horn County, Wyoming. Today, they are located in Park County, Wyoming."

"On 12 July 1906, Addie and Catherine were returning from a fishing trip on Wood River to their home on Gooseberry. According to newspaper accounts, there had been a "cloud-burst storm" that raised the creek. As they reached Iron Creek, and started to ford it in their buggy, the flood waters came down upon them. Addie's brother-in-law, John Henry Doores, was riding along behind and being on higher ground, saw the bank of water approaching, but was not near

enough to warn them in time. There had been a bridge across Iron Creek, without rails. The flood had already washed out the bridge before they arrived, but they couldn't see it was gone and drove down into the creek. Both Addie and Catherine were drowned. Even their team of horses died. Addie and Catherine's bodies were recovered, and laid out for burial in the W. T. Benbrooks' general store. They were buried in the Meeteetse Cemetery, Meeteetse, Wyoming. They had no children. George Renner had a large monument erected in their memory."

"Addie and Catherine died intestate, or without a will. Catherine's estate was paid to her mother, and settled in April 1908. The probate records do not state what became of her personal affects.

"Addie's brother, George was appointed as the administrator of his estate, and W. L. Simpson was the attorney. Fred A. Whitney, William O. Steele and Adam Hogg were appointed to appraise the estate. The heirs included Addie's mother Mariam Renner, his half-sister Phoebe (Renner) Palmer, sisters Martha (Renner) Henry, Carsie (Renner) Doores, Emma E. Renner and brother George H. Renner. His assets were valued at \$80,482.28 and included:

- 14,400 mixed sheep and lambs
- 129,600 pounds of wool approximated in 1907
- 21 head of neat stock cattle
- 20 head of horses more or less
- 6 sheep wagons
- 3 trap wagons
- 1 saddle
- 1 stacking outfit with buck rakes
- 4 sets double harness
- plows, harrows and incidental farming machinery
- Household furniture
- Hay, quantity unknown
- Bank stocks, First National Bank of Worland, Wyoming \$7,000.00
- Bank stocks, First National of Thermopolis, Wyoming \$2,000.00
- Bank stock, Amoretti Barclay & Co., Bridger, Montana \$2,000.00
- Monies in banks estimated at \$10,000.00
- Other personal property not herein enumerated \$2,500.00
- Considerable real estate in and near Meeteetse, Wyoming with a probable value of \$14,000.00, including the location of the Rocky Mt Bell Telephone Co. in Meeteetse ."

"His estate was split among his heirs. John Henry Doores and Addie's sister Carsie ran most of the Gooseberry Creek operation. Doores eventually went bankrupt, and he and Carsie divorced. Addie's sister, Emma, ran the ranch for a time, then sold it to George Renner's oldest son, Clifton Adison Renner, for taxes. Clifton's son, Paddy, and his children, Rori and Albert, own and operate the ranch today."
